

Make the Most of Your Trip to a Children's Museum

➤ **Call Ahead or Visit a Children's Museum Web Site**

By checking-in ahead, you can learn about seasonal programs, permanent and traveling exhibits, admission days and costs, as well as if the museum has a café or allows visitors to bring their own snacks and beverages. The size, type of exhibits and operations differ greatly among children's museums, which means each children's museum offers a unique experience. When arriving at a museum, study the map of the gallery floor and check the daily performance and activity schedules.

➤ **Let Your Child Be the Guide**

While it may be tempting to nudge your child along so that the family can see every exhibit and participate in every activity in order to get the full "value" of the museum, your child may equate quality rather than quantity as the best indicator of time well spent. So go ahead and let your children explore just one or two exhibits.

➤ **Support Your Child's Learning and Play Styles**

One of the best ways to do this is by asking questions that don't require a yes or no response. Such as: What do you think will happen next? Why do you think the (object) works that way? After you leave the children's museum, you may find yourselves in a place that reminds you of an exhibit. Use these moments to reflect with your children about the museum experience and how it compares with the present environment. Be prepared for some surprising discoveries!



A family membership with your local community children's museum provides your family free admission, a great value for frequent visits. By upgrading to a family membership with Association of Children's Museums (ACM) Reciprocal Program benefits, your local membership card provides free admission — *for a minimum of four (4) visitors from the same household* — to more than 180 participating museums. Chances are, there is a children's museum near a vacation destination or close to a long-distance relative. Turn your local membership pass into a national passport!

Please Keep in Mind

Most — but not all — children's museums are Reciprocal participants.

For admission, visitors must present a valid membership card with an ACM Reciprocal Program logo. Reciprocal admission privileges do extend to special exhibits, but do not extend to discounts for gift shop or café purchases, museum special events, programs, summer camps or birthday parties.

It is always a good idea to call a museum before visiting. Some museums expand the minimum admission policy. A few restrict free admission privileges. An asterisk symbol (*) after a museum name in this brochure indicates a restriction, and an explanation follows.
